- 2. Similarities between Acts 9:1-19, Acts 22:3-21, and Acts 26:1-26:
- a. Paul's status before his conversion.
- b. Paul's conversion took place along the road to Damascus where he was headed from Jerusalem.
- c. Each account mentions a powerful light from heaven.
- d. The dialogue between Jesus and Paul.
- e. All three versions of Paul's story of conversion also include his call to ministry.
- 3. How does Paul move himself out of the way so that we can see Jesus?
- a. Paul keeps Jesus central to his story by naming him in it.
- b. Paul keeps Jesus central to his story by doing what Jesus tells him to do.
- c. Paul keeps Jesus central to his story by letting Jesus speak for himself.
- 4. How will we reflect *the light of the world* into our world? How might we let Jesus speak for himself in our conversations with others? Memorized verses? Paraphrased thoughts? Stories about him to illustrate a point? Jesus as conversation starter?

- d. What impact does Paul's testimony have on you?

- 5. What is God doing in your life (or around you) right now and how can you talk about that in such a way as to keep Jesus at the center of the story AND in such a way as people would receive it?
