Worship Through the Bible: Part 1 Sunday Nov. 6, 2016

1. The English word "worship" comes from two Old English words: *weorth*, which means "worth," and *scipe* or *ship*, which means something like "shape" or "quality."

2. Worth-shape: Whatever we worship shapes us.

6. What needs to change in my day-to-day life to make it more consistent with my participation in a Sunday morning worship service? I know I don't need to be perfect – but I also don't want to be hypocritical.
