The Call of Zechariah: PREPARE Sunday Nov. 27, 2016

1. The story of Zechariah: VIDEO

2. "The Bible testifies that God has provided assistance for us in our spiritual conflicts. We are not alone in this world! The Bible teaches us that God's Holy Spirit has been given to empower us and guide us..."

3. "Also, the Bible – in nearly three hundred different places – also teaches that God has countless angels at His command. Furthermore, God has commissioned these angels to aid His children in their struggles against Satan..."

4. "If the activities of the devil and his demons seem to be intensifying in these days, as I believe they are, should not the incredibly greater supernatural powers of God's holy angels be even more indelibly impressed on the minds of people of faith?..."

5. "After all, references to the holy angels in the Bible far outnumber references to Satan and his subordinate demons. If you are a believer, expect mighty angels to accompany you in your life experiences..." *Billy Graham*

6. Luke 1:1-4

7. "Luke opens his gospel with a long, formal sentence, like a huge stone entrance welcoming you (us) impressively to a large building. Here, he is saying, is something solid, something you can trust. Readers would know they were beginning a serious, well-researched piece of work. This wasn't a fly-by-night or casual account. It would hold its head up in the world at large." *N.T. Wright*
