Part Two: God Sent His Son to Save Us from Sin Sunday December 10, 2017

- 2. Jesus is God with us, come to show us God's love, save us from sin, set up God's kingdom, AND shut down religion, so we can share in God's life.
- 3. What is sin?
- 4. The English word "sin" is translated from the Greek word "hamartia" which means "to miss the mark to fail to hit the bull's eye to be off target."
- 5. *Hamartia* comes from two words: ha a negative word meaning "not" a and meros a meaning "to be a part of" or "together with." So a sin means to not be a part of what we were meant to be together with. In other words a and in short a sin is separation.
- 6. Separation from what?
 - Sin separates us.
 - Sin separates us from who we were.
 - Sin separate us from who we were *meant to be*.
 - Sin separates us from who we were meant to be with (Isa. 59:1-2).
 - Sin separates us from who we were meant to be with *forever*.
- 7. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive (1 Cor. 15:21-22).
- 8. In Christ we are saved from judgment (Jn. 5:24; Ro. 3:23-24; 8:1-2).
- 9. In Christ we are saved from wrath (Ro. 1:18).
- 10. In Christ we are saved from contaminated blood (1 Jn. 1:7).
- 11. For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more (Heb. 8:12).
- 12. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ (Eph. 2:13).
- 13. Jesus undoes the separation that sin has caused. If sin separates then Jesus reunites... us... with who we were... meant to be... with... forever
